Two ABD Geargrinders, two Bicycle Heaven and two NOW riders. Correa and Lesniakowski without a team mate in this group must grab a train ride to the front or perhaps hop from one to the other. With the bell comes the wind up to the finish, I would bet the Jeff-Josh turbos are on, with Josh waiting to round the final turn.
