A spectacular day of racing at the Kenosha Velosport Spring Training Criterium # 2 in the Series. City of Pleasant Prairie workers had the course completely blocked by 7am, which was great for a good warm-up.

The weather was sunny all day, temps at 9am 41, 10am 44, 11am to 3pm 49 and dropped to 43 at 4pm.

This D shaped .7 mile course drops gradually to the north side turn 4 then after turn 4 you climb to highest point and descend a bit to finish line. Perhaps 10 or 20 feet elevation change.

Location: LakeView Corporate Park is located in Pleasant Prairie, WI. Take I-94 to Hwy 165, go east. Turn on left on 80th Ave., Parking at 10303 80th Ave, Pleasant Prairie, WI

Racing started at 9am with the combined field of Master 60 through 80+ and a second field of Master Women 40 through 70+, Women Open & Women Cat 4/5.

Kallas and Vichotka attempted to break away the second lap but 4 other riders were able to hang. This group including McGovern, Beck, Murphy lapped the other riders. 1st year 60+ Stern latched on and in the last few laps he was pushing the pace up the “hill” eventually getting away from the riders who lapped him. This caused some concern, was he lapped or not? Stern wins the field finish (Kallas was up a lap); Vichotka and Beck battled for 2nd.
